- **All books must be read before the first day of school. Students are expected to read the novels in their entirety. Sparknotes is not an option.
- **You will be tested on the content of the novels/play the first week of school.
 - Essay will be due the first full day of class. Turnitin will be ready on Orientation Day.
 - Essay must be typed using MLA format 12pt, double-spaced,
 Times New Roman.
 - You will need to include textual evidence from the novel; please be sure to use MLA parenthetical notation (Fitzgerald 25).
 - You must include a Works Cited page.
- **2.** Select **ONE** of the topics below and write a (minimum) of two pages (you may go over two pages; however, your paper should not exceed four pages).
- 1.) Character Influence: Choose from among the following characters and write an essay analyzing the function or role the character(s) play in the novella. Specifically, you should discuss how the character(s) contribute to Blanche's mental, physical, and emotional breakdown as well as the illumination of major themes explored by the play. Be sure to use direct quotes and examples from the play to support your literary analysis.
- **2.) Character Analysis:** Nick Carraway says that Gatsby is worth more than all of the people. Discuss whether he's right or wrong. What makes Gatsby great? Consider his character, his actions, his beliefs, and the rest of his life. Be sure to use direct quotes and examples from the play to support your literary analysis.
